Beloved in Christ,

What a year we have all endured! Pandemic, protests and politics. We have isolated, washed our hands till they are raw, hidden our faces with masks and kept social distance. We have done so because we love each other and want to keep each other and our families safe. It has been a challenge. A friend of mine recently commented that because we have not been able to touch – no hugs, no handshakes – we are skin deprived.

The seasons of Advent and Christmas remind us that there is an antidote for skin depravation and that is the Incarnation. In the fullness of time, the Bible tells us, God sent his Son into the world. Hear the Good News this season of our lives, God in Jesus Christ is with us.
